NO DOGS ALLOWED IN LIVESTOCK PAVILION

GENERAL RULES:

- All parties participating at Montana State Fair Events are responsible for reading the **General Information & Montana Department of Livestock Health, Brand and Import** sections of this handbook and complying with the policies listed therein.
- No entry will be considered complete unless accompanied by appropriate entry fees. **Late entries are subject to double entry fees on a space available basis.**
- Each exhibitor shall purchase admittance tickets. A \$15 season ticket that will admit one person plus vehicle is available. Exhibitors 6-18 years may purchase a \$10 season ticket that will admit one for the week, no vehicles. State Fair will provide one additional season admission ticket for each \$50 of entry fees.
- AGREEMENT TO ALL RULES AND REGULATIONS HEREIN STATED IS UNDERSTOOD WHEN THE EXHIBITOR SUBMITS THE ENTRY FORM.**
- Use the entry form included in this book to enter sheep divisions. Additional forms can be obtained from Montana State Fair by calling 727-8900 or by duplicating form in book. Entry forms and fees may be delivered to State Fair administration office, open weekdays 8 am to 5 pm. Mailed entry forms and fees should be sent to: Entry Office, Montana State Fair, PO Box 1888, Great Falls, MT 59403.
- All possible care will be exercised by State Fair in handling exhibits, but no responsibility for loss or damage in transit or during any phase of the exhibit will be assumed by State Fair.

- Shows are sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association for an open doe show for the following breeds; Recorded Grades, Alpine, LaMancha, Nubian, AOPB, Junior and Senior Does and ADGA rules shall govern. Divisions will be held for unrecorded does not sanctioned by ADGA.
- All entries must be AGS Purebreds or ADGA Purebreds, Americans and Recorded Grades, ADGA rules shall govern.
- The original registration certificate is required for all animals six months of age or older and must be shown to the Show Secretary before the start of the show. The original registration certificate or duplicate application stamped by the ADGA office is required for all animals under six months of age, and this must be shown to the Show Secretary before the start of the show. No copies of the registration certificate or the stamped duplicate application, telegram or phone calls will be accepted in lieu of the original certificate.
- FEES CHARGED FOR EACH SHOW ONLY AS FOLLOWS:** \$5 per head office charge; List number of pens needed on entry, pens are approximately 8 x 5 feet. No pen fees.
- Exhibitors arriving at Montana State Fair are assured clean pens. Pens will be assigned by Montana State Fair and will be posted in the barn.
- Twenty (20) animals per breed are required for a show. If sufficient entries are not received the particular division may be held for ribbons only. If 20 head are not exhibited in any given breed show there may be no separate listing for that breed the following year in the premium book. **TWENTY (20) HEAD WILL BE REQUIRED FOR THE 2004 SHOWS.**
- There is no limit to the number an exhibitor may enter per class. If competition is from only one exhibitor, premiums paid on the first two places only. **"ONE EXHIBITOR" IS DEFINED AS ONE FAMILY AND/OR ONE BUSINESS PARTNERSHIP.**
- All champions must be present for Best of Show.
- No horned goats will be allowed. Scurs are acceptable.
- All animals shown in group or challenge classes must stay within their regular divisions, with the exception of ADGA champions.
- There will be pre-show milkouts, 7 pm, the evening before each show.
- Animals will be released early at the discretion of the superintendent with prior arrangements.
- Health requirements: All animals must be free of all communicable diseases and active abscesses. Superintendent reserves the right to ask for the removal of any animals exhibiting signs of disease or infection. In case of dispute a veterinarian may be called at the exhibitor's expense.
- All goats must have an official scrapies ID.**

An official ADGA rosette will be awarded to the Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion of each sanctioned breed of each individual official ADGA show.

- USE SEPARATE ENTRY FORMS for Show ONE and Show TWO
- Write Show Number on entry form.**
- Unrecorded to follow ADGA show.
- Only dairy goats allowed.
- No horned goats allowed. Scurs are acceptable.
- SHOW TWO is for RIBBONS and LEGS only.**
