All animals will be released after Grand Drive. Animals not entered in the State Fair 4-H Show must be removed from the Livestock Pavilion tie stalls and pens by 7 am Tuesday August 2.

Every effort will be made to follow above schedule, but due to unforeseen circumstances schedule is subject to change.

Premium checks will be available during the Fair at the State Fair Bank. Please check with the department superintendent on dates of availability. Checks not collected will be mailed the week following the Fair.

ATTENTION:
All cattle, sheep, swine, and goats will need a **Veterinary Health Inspection Certificate issued within 20 days of exhibit.** Certificate must accompany the animal upon arrival on the grounds and be available for examination for the duration of exhibit.

- GENERAL RULES:**
- a. All participants at Montana State Fair Events are responsible for reading the **General Information & Montana Department of Livestock Health, Brand and Import** sections of this handbook and complying with the policies listed therein.
 - b. Entry forms must be complete with all applicable information, signatures, and fees submitted for acceptance.
 - c. All livestock exhibitors, herdsman and owners will purchase admittance tickets. A \$15 season ticket includes 10 adult admissions and/or a vehicle. Exhibitors 6-18 years may purchase a \$10 season ticket that includes 10 admissions--no vehicle. State Fair will provide one additional season admission ticket for each \$50 of entry fees.
 - d. **AGREEMENT TO ALL RULES AND REGULATIONS HEREIN STATED IS UNDERSTOOD WHEN THE EXHIBITOR SUBMITS THE ENTRY FORM.**
 - e. Use the entry form included in this book to enter Junior Livestock divisions. Additional forms can be obtained from Montana State Fair by calling 727-8900, going online to montanastatefair.com or by duplicating form in book. Entry forms and fees may be delivered to State Fair administration office, open weekdays 8 am to 5 pm. Mailed entry forms and fees should be sent to: Entry Office, Montana State Fair, 400 3rd ST NW, Great Falls, MT 59404.
 - f. All possible care will be exercised by State Fair in handling exhibits, but no responsibility for loss or damage in transit or during any phase of the exhibit will be assumed by State Fair.
 - g. Champion exhibitors may be required to make publicity appearances. Cooperation is expected.
 - h. If entries warrant, classes may be divided at the discretion of Montana State Fair management.
 - i. All animals will be health & brand inspected **BEFORE** being allowed in the barn.

- j. Animals will be stalled in the Livestock Pavilion on wood chips/shavings. First bedding will be provided.
- k. No additional fees are charged for fitting chutes or tie outs, but this privilege is allowed in designated areas only. Blocking & grooming chute(s) will not be allowed in the alleys.
- l. No floor standing fans will be permitted in the aisles and alleys. Fans may be hung from exhibitor provided frames but electrical service is limited.
- m. Show numbers will be assigned per head and exhibitors are required to wear the assigned number at all times the individual animal is being judged.
- n. Exhibitors are requested to call the State Fair Entry Office for information pertinent to their exhibit.
- o. All market lamb and hog exhibitors must be bonafide 4-H or FFA members. All market steer and heifer exhibitors must be bonafide members of 4-H, FFA or a nationally recognized junior beef breed association.
- p. There is no limit on the number of animals an exhibitor may enter and show.
- q. Market animals will be ranked based on visual evaluation of market-ready quality..
- r. Show is non-terminal. No sale or floor price purchase is available. Any private-treaty sale must not be finalized prior to selection of champion animals.

HEIFER SHOW

REGULATIONS:

- a. All registered heifers must have original registration papers in the sole name(s) of the exhibitor prior to June 15 of the current year. All registered heifers must be identified with a permanent tattoo corresponding to original registration papers which must be present with the heifer at check-in.
- b. Heifers that are registered in a farm name or whose papers include the name of adults are not eligible to show. Heifers may be co-owned and co-registered by two or more members of the same family.
- c. Registered heifers of a breed division not listed will be shown in the registered other breed heifer classes. If 5 or more heifers of a breed not listed are entered, a separate breed division will be added.
- d. Any classes with 10 or more entries will be split.
- e. All cattle must be halter broke and manageable

DIVISION 14: MARKET STEERS

REGULATIONS:

- a. Minimum weight 1000 pounds.
- b. Ownership data for steers is January 1 of current year.
- c. Steers will be hip height measured and sorted into classes by height regardless of breed.Future shows may offer breed divisions if sufficient entries and breed association support warrants.
- d. Steers will be weighed and weights made available to judge. Montana State Fair reserves the right to weigh back any steer following exhibition. A variance of no more than 5 percent difference from the weigh-in weight is recommended. A variance of more than 10 percent may result in disqualification.
- e. Montana State Fair reserves the right to collect saliva, urine or blood samples on any animal for testing of forbidden drugs or medication.

REGULATIONS:

- a. Minimum weight 220 pounds
- b. Gilts or barrows are eligible.
- c. Ownership date for hogs is May 1 of current year.
- d. Hogs will be weighed and sorted into classes by weight. Montana State Fair reserves the right to weigh back any hog immediately following exhibition. A variation of less than 5 percent difference from weigh-in weight is recommended. A variation of more than 5 percent may result in disqualification.

- b. Ewe or wether lambs are eligible.
- c. Ownership data for lambs is May 1 of the current year.
- d. Lambs will be weighed and sorted into classes by weight. Montana State Fair reserves the right to weigh back any lamb immediately following exhibition. A variation of less than 5 percent difference from weigh-in weight is recoverable. A variation of more than 5 percent may result in disqualification.
